History

City History

The *City of Cuyahoga Falls* was founded in 1812 by William Wetmore to develop land owned by Judge Joshua Stow of Middletown, Connecticut. It was originally named Manchester and later changed, at the request of the Ohio Postmaster General, to its present name, Cuyahoga Falls.

Today the City of Cuyahoga Falls has a population of 50,000 and is 27.8 square miles.

Chamber History

The *Cuyahoga Falls Chamber of Commerce* began in the fall of 1926 by a group of businessmen and property owners. At the Annual Meeting of the Falls Civic Association, a committee of 15 was appointed for the purpose of organizing a Chamber of Commerce. The first meeting was held at the City Hall on November 24, 1926, followed by a membership campaign in January 1927.
